Subject: Request for a Ministerial Decision - CS-48768 / 4102-07-0155

I am writing to inform you of the ministerial decision on the above-noted appeal.

I have reviewed the enforcement action, the evidence and the law as it applies to your case. I have fully considered the documentation you provided as well as the reports from the issuing office.

Decision

After considering all of the circumstances, I have decided, under the provisions of section 131 of the *Customs Act*, that there has not been a contravention of the *Customs Act* or the Regulations with respect to the goods seized.

Under the provisions of section 132 of the *Customs Act*, removal from custody of the seized Kershaw knives is hereby forthwith authorized. If release of the goods is not taken on the foregoing terms within 30 days from the date of this Notice, they will be considered as unclaimed and disposed of.

Reasons

On the basis of the information available to me, it has been determined that a contravention of the Customs Act or the regulations did not occur, in that the Kershaw knives were properly reported to the CBSA and, therefore, not subject to seizure. The knives were sent for classification to CBSA's Trade Compliance Division and found to be not prohibited.

Should you wish to take release of the goods and import them into Canada, you may also be responsible for the payment of any applicable duties or taxes.

Please be advised that all Customs enforcement records relating to this incident will be cancelled. The Agency apologizes for any inconvenience this matter may have caused.
